TUESDAYS

Understanding Abstract Art

Avril Angevine

June 28 - July 26 (no class July 5), 10:00 - 11:40 am I Zoom, Recorded*

Abstract Art: Whirling colors, sinuous lines, thick paint--and not a face, a tree, a cow in sight! Is abstraction supposed to be hard - or easy? Where did it come from? Why did it dominate mid-century art? What does it offer to the viewer, or the painter? Explore the mystery and magic of abstract art in this four-session course. We'll look at the beginnings of abstraction in the early 20th century, move on to the heyday of American Abstract Expressionism of the 40s and 50s, and finish by examining the kinds of abstraction produced now.

WEDNESDAYS

Theodore Roosevelt's America Mick Chantler (in Person)

July 6 - 27 10:00 - 11:40 am I Guzman Hall - Not Recorded

Teddy Roosevelt was one of perhaps five or six truly transformative presidents in American history. A cultivated, scholarly aristocrat, Roosevelt entered politics during the nation's "gilded age," much to the dismay of his peers who regarded government as a tawdry affair dominated by saloonkeepers and greedy commercial types. In the course of his thirty years in public service, he resolved to restore the "heroic, mWanly virtueWs" and a sense of sublime destiny to American life. This course will examine the career of this remarkable—if often abrasive and authoritarian—American statesman.

THURSDAYS

Enlisting the Music: American Popular Song in WWII Dave Radlauer

June 23 - July 28 10:00 - 11:40 am | Zoom: Recorded*

American musical entertainment during the Second World War supplied a strategic reserve of morale-building and national spirit. Rosie the Riveter and the Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy symbolized the dedicated workers and brave soldiers who fought and won the war. Each class will show 10 audiovisual clips from 1940-45 offering a fresh view of wartime culture. Movie musicals, radio broadcasts and the V-Discs shipped to troops united Americans in a common cause. While fighting and winning a global conflict, Generation Swing briefly rediscovered the national credo, E Pluribus Unum: "Out of Many, One."

FRIDAYS

Motown Records: The Greatest Soul Music Record Label Richie Unterberger (in Person)

June 24 - July 29 10:00 - 11:40 am I Guzman Hall - Not Recorded

More than any other record company, Motown represented a sound and a style, helping to define soul music with hundreds of hits in the 1960s and 1970s. Using both common and rare recordings and video clips, this course lays out the label's history from its beginnings in Detroit in the late 1950s to its growth to the most successful independent record label of all time. Many legends of soul music will be seen, heard, and discussed all the way, including the Supremes, Smokey Robinson, the Temptations, Mary Wells, Martha & the Vandellas, Marvin Gaye, Stevie Wonder, and the Jackson Five.

SPECIAL LECTURE DESCRIPTIONS

The US Capitol Insurrection of January 6, 2021, and The Plot to Overthrow F.D.R. in 1933, Oak Dowling

Tuesday, June 21 | 10:00 - 11:40 am | Zoom, Not Recorded

This lecture will attempt to investigate who is responsible for the recent insurrection and the 1933 overthrow plot. A mob of 2,000–2,500 supporters of U.S. President Donald Trump attacked the Capitol Building in Washington, D.C. They sought to overturn his defeat in the 2020 presidential election by disrupting the joint session of Congress assembled to count electoral votes that would formalize President-elect Joe Biden's victory. Many died or were injured. The 1933 political conspiracy was fomented by the "White House Putsch" and was exposed by Smedley Butler, Major General of the Marines. We will compare the 1933 plot with the January 2021 plot. Both plots were designed to overthrow our democracy and install an unelected dictator.

From Opera To Hollywood: Opera Scenes in the Movies, **Kip Cranna** Wednesday, June 22 | 10:00 - 11:40 am | Zoom, Not Recorded

When the music of opera is heard in the movies, it often produces surprising, unexpected, and even incongruous results. San Francisco Opera Dramaturg Emeritus Kip Cranna will explore video examples of important opera-to-cinema transformations in films from the Marx Brothers to the current day, by such famed directors as Francis Ford Coppola, Martin Scorsese, Norman Jewison, Gary Marshall, Woody Allen, Lars von Trier, and Jonathan Demme. Join the discussion and tell us about your own favorite opera scene in the movies.

On the Waterfront, Cary Pepper

Monday, June 27 | 10:00 - 11:40 am | Zoom, Not Recorded

On the Waterfront was the next film Elia Kazan made after his controversial testimony before the House Un-American Activities Committee (HUAC). Some have called it a justification for "naming names" before the committee. Others view it as simply a cinematic masterpiece that brought a new kind of realism to American film. We'll look at both sides – and a lot more – as we explore this classic. Starring Marlon Brando in one of his mostacclaimed performances, and the film debuts of Eva Marie Saint and Rod Steiger, On the Waterfront received 12 Oscar nominations and won 8, including Best Picture and Best Director.

The Art of Nature: Three Stages in Cultivating Aesthetic Experience, **Bruce Elliott** Wednesday, June 29 | 10:00 - 11:40 am | Zoom, Not Recorded

This presentation explores the relationship between art and nature, as viewed through the agency of perception. We begin with the traditional objective approach by tracing the evolution of artistic depictions of natural settings from the Renaissance to Romanticism. We'll then view works by modern artists like Mark Rothko who encourage active participation by the viewer in the artistic process. We'll culminate by touching upon visual practices that enable a person taking a walk in the woods to generate for themselves a luminous aesthetic experience..

When does registration begin?

Registration for the Summer 2022 Session opens Tuesday, May 31, 2022 at 7 am.

How do I register?

There are two ways to register. Visit dominican.edu/olli and click the Register Online button on our website, or complete and mail the paper form on page 9 to OLLI, Dominican University, 50 Acacia Avenue, San Rafael, CA 94901.

May I register by phone?

If you are having trouble registering online, we can help. Contact our office for assistance: email olli@dominican.edu or call 415-458-3763.

How do I know my enrollment is confirmed?

You will receive your confirmation via email.

What is the OLLI refund policy?

Members are eligible for a refund of all fees except the membership fee of \$20, provided that a written request is received via email before the first class of the session.

What is the OLLI guest policy?

Guests are welcome. You may invite a friend, or friends, to visit a course once; however, guests must register for the course in order to continue beyond a first visit.

Does OLLI offer scholarships?

Yes. If you wish to be considered for a scholarship, please send an email with the subject line SCHOLARSHIP. Include your contact information and most recent tax statement (the page with the taxable income). Please send any requests before May 31. If you are selected for a scholarship, you pay only the membership fee of \$20 each session and may attend one course (or up to four one-off lectures) in the summer session.

Are discounts offered on courses?

Yes. Individuals who have never taken a Dominican OLLI course are eligible for a NEW TO OLLI discount on their first course. Also, Dominican University faculty, staff, and alumni are eligible for discounts. Please note: discounts are not extended to family members, and can only be applied by office personnel. Please contact the office for assistance.

Are the OLLI offices open on the Dominican campus?

As of the time of this printing, the OLLI on-campus offices are not open, but this may change at any time. During business hours, we are available to assist OLLI members via phone: (415) 458-3763.

For the courses on Zoom, if two of us live in the same household, are we

obliged to register and pay as individual OLLI members? On this issue we would like to appeal to your sense of honesty. The pandemic reduced enrollments, and OLLI's ability to function depends on member tuition. If you are able to register and pay as individuals, we ask you to do so.
